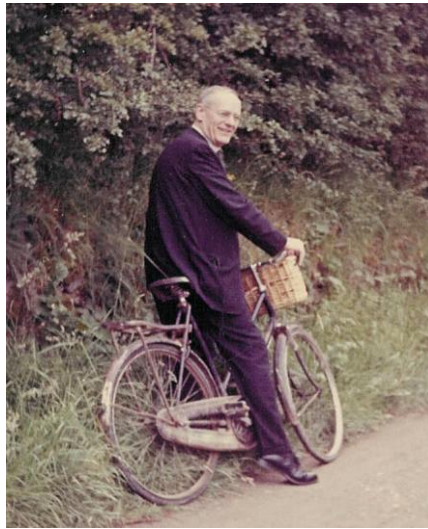

Why I believe that our family of Floods

are related to the Floods of Lenamore, Co. Longford:

1. The common use of such names as William, John, James, Robert
2. The similarity of facial features, such as the high forehead and the ears.

Michael Donnelly, aged 84, of Lenamore (He has two sisters and a brother living in Providence, R. I.), the first time he saw me in Lenamore remarked to Mary Flood that I looked just like John Flood, the uncle of Vincent Flood. He noticed also and especially the walk.

3. Vincent Flood, of Lenamore, tells me that his family came to the Lenamore, Co. Longford area, from just across the Westmeath Co. line, near Milltown, about 150 years ago - which might account for the mention of Longford and Westmeath in our own family tradition.

Whether you come from near at hand or have travelled from distant parts you are very welcome to our village of Lenamore in South Longford. Lenamore -the big meadow - derives its name from the vast expanse of meadow and grazing land in its vicinity. The land around Lenamore is rich and fertile and is regarded as one of the leading cattle fattening areas of Ireland.

Situated near the Westmeath border and forming part of ancient Teffia, the Lenamore area is steeped in history. At Agharra, two miles west of the village, stands an ivy-clad, ruined castle of the O'Farrells, Chieftains of Longford.

The ruins of Rathreagh are those of a Church erected in the early years of the 17th century by Nathaniel Fox, a local landlord. This we learn from the inscription on his tomb in the Church. This tomb is a sarcophagus surmounted by the armour-clad, recumbent figure of Nathaniel and locally referred to as the "stone man".

Quite near the venue for the Drama Final is a "Mass Rock", - proof that the harsh Penal Laws cast their shadow across this corner of Ireland; proof too that the people of Lenamore were unwavering in loyalty to their Faith. In fact the very name of the parish - Legan (the Rock) - reminds us to-day of our proud heritage.

The area to which you have come to-night had close connections with the Fenians of 1867. Only a short distance from here flows the river Inny, immortalised by the Longford poet, John Keegan Casey, in his "The Rising of the Moon". In the mid 19th century, the young men of Lenamore and adjoining areas met 'in the old spot by the river' to drill and train secretly by moonlight. Period swords and pikes found in the vicinity point to an active Fenian Branch in the district.

Lenamore is proud of the number of her native sons who became eminent Churchmen. Dr. Peter Flood, Professor and Superior of the University of Lombards and later to become the second President of Maynooth College, was born here in 1750. His Grace, Most Reverend Patrick K. Flood, Archbishop of Trinidad (1889) claimed Lenamore as his birthplace. Nearer our own day, Right Reverend Monsignor Langan, Vicar General of the Diocese of Ardagh and Clonmacnoise (1927-1951), saw light of day here. At the age of 98 Monsignor Langan was the oldest Ecclesiastic in the world. His life spanned the reign of five Popes and he had Audiences with all of them.

The Parochial Hall here, venue for the 1970 Macra Drama Final, was built in the record time of three months and was formally opened on 8th December, 1949, by Monsignor Langan. He named it the "Aurora" meaning "Dawn". It certainly marked the dawn of a new, brighter era for the area, and it is fitting that, 21 years later, The Aurora Hall should, at its coming of age, have the honour of staging the Macra Drama Final.

With this picture of a typical country village and with these few fragments of parochial history, it is our earnest wish that you enjoy your short visit and that you will take away pleasant memories of our county and village.

The man who led the first Irish troops

A GOLDEN JUBILEE could have been celebrated on Sunday last, but wasn't. On Sunday, December 17, 1922, the last regiments of British troops evacuated Dublin. No fewer than 18 military establishments changed hands on that day; eighteen Union Jacks were lowered for the last time, and eighteen Tricolours were raised in their places. The bitter history which began with Strongbow had ended — or should have ended.

This significant event was not ceremoniously remembered on Sunday last, December 17, 1972. Instead, there was the usual crop of commemorations for men who died in the civil war. Would it not have been better, and certainly less

A few years later, Captain Flood left the Army and joined the Marist Order. Subsequently he spent 25 years on the mission field in China, and now he's full of life in retirement at Moyle Park College, Dublin. Had the mass evacuation been commemorated on Sunday, he would have been an honoured participant.

Talking of commemorations, is it not time to call an end to all the annual events which take place, and to set one day aside for remembering everyone who has died to attain Irish independence? Endless commemorations show an unhealthy preoccupation with a past which is often best forgotten; it is even worse when public men in high places pay tribute at the graves of men

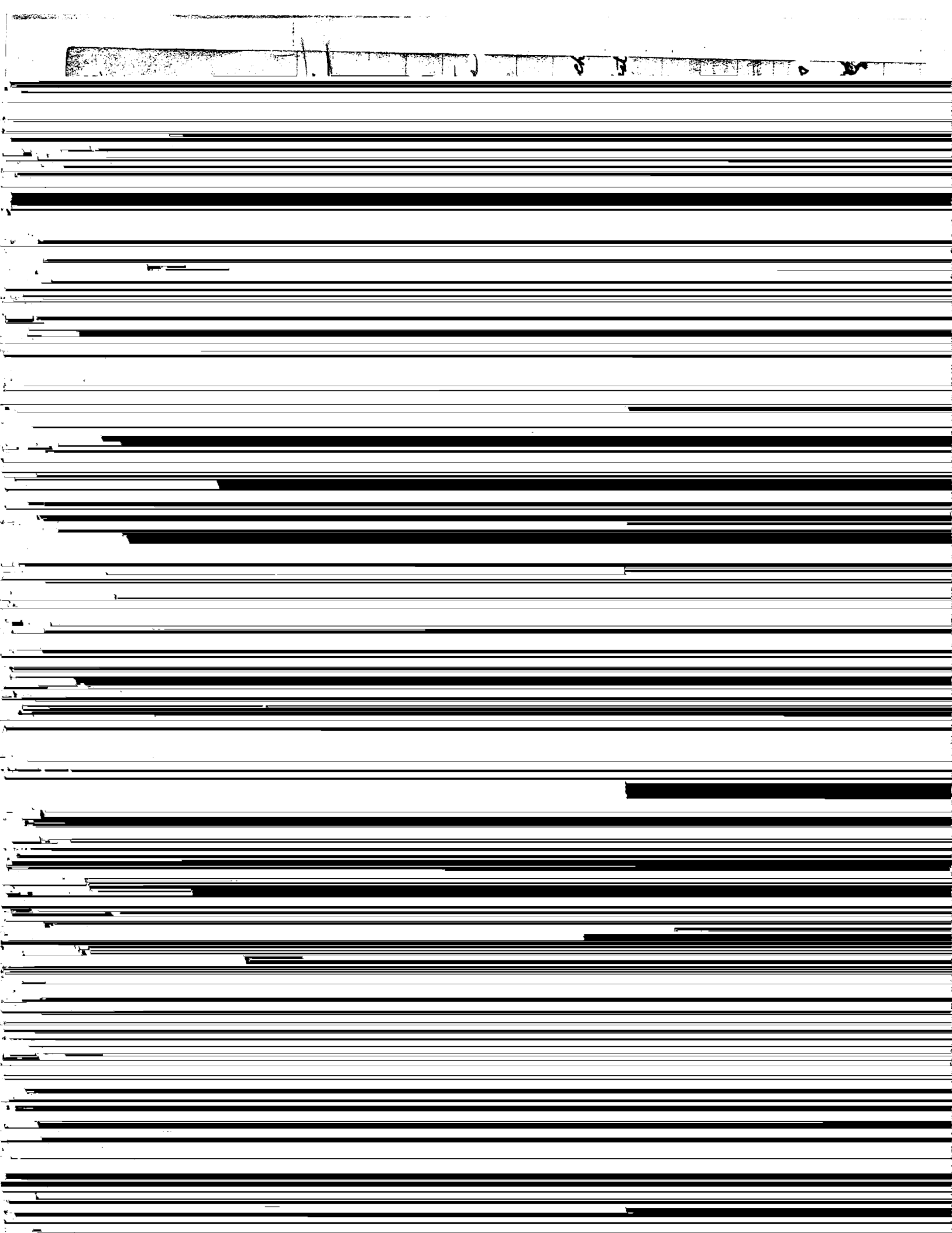

THE sudden death of Rev. Thomas Kellegher, P.P., Legan, which occurred on 28th June at St. Mel's College, Longford, while on annual retreat, evoked widespread sympathy throughout the diocese of Ardagh and Clonmacnois, and especially among his own parishioners, his native Gortlettera, and not least of all Kiltubrid, where he had been curate prior to his appointment as Parish Priest of Legan in 1970.

Born in Annaghmore, Gortlettera, Father Kellegher was educated at Drumgowna National School, St. Mel's College, Longford, and St. Patrick's College, Maynooth, where he was ordained to the priesthood in 1933. Following his ordination he served for a brief period on the English mission at Liverpool, and on his return to the diocese of Ardagh he took up duty at Shannonbridge, Co. Offaly. He later served at Lanesboro, Abbeyshrule, Drumlish, Aughavas, Killoe, Dromard, and Kiltubrid.

Legan, the schoolchildren of the parish, to whom the deceased had endeared himself, formed a Guard of Honour, while members of the local GAA club—Legan Slashers, carried the remains into the church. His Lordship, Most Rev. Cahal B. Daly, D.D., Bishop of Ardagh and Clonmacnois, led the congregation in the recitation of the prayers for the dead and in words of tribute to the deceased said that Father Kellegher was a man of simple faith without guile. In the people's hour of sorrow he said that the circumstances of his passing at the altar of God was a happy consolation to all.

On the following day interment took place in the local church grounds and the very large attendance included many of his former Maynooth classmates as well as clergy from the adjoining dioceses. On Tuesday July 4th a special Mass was offered for the repose of the soul of the deceased in St. Brigid's Church, Kiltubrid. The celebrant was Rev. G. McEvilly, C.C., and on Tuesday July 11th the school children of Legan parish attended a special Mass for the deceased at which Rev. J. Brennan, C.C., was the celebrant. ...Father Kellegher is survived by his brother Patrick (Gortlettera).
